What is CAHSC?

Capital Area Healthy Start Coalition (CAHSC) is a non profit organization committed to enhancing the health and well-being of infants and their families in Leon and Wakulla Counties.

Established in 1992, our organization, rooted in the community, aims to assist pregnant women, new parents, fathers, and families with infants up to three years old who may face challenges such as poor birth outcomes and developmental delays. Our objectives include enhancing maternal and infant health, providing access to care, offering education on healthy pregnancies, child development, breastfeeding, women's health, as well as support and care coordination for all families.

In the fiscal year 2023-2024, our team of 23 employees supported over 4,800 pregnant women, families, and infants through our seven direct client programs. We deliver home visiting services in collaboration with the Florida Department of Health, Healthy Start MomCare Network, Inc., Florida Association of Healthy Start Coalitions (FAHSC), and Community Human Services Partnership.

2023-2024 ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The dedicated staff at Capital Area Healthy Start Coalition engages in thousands of hours of community outreach each year, participating in diverse activities to raise awareness about their essential services and forge valuable partnerships. Their involvement spans events, health fairs, workshops, and training sessions, all aimed at underscoring the critical importance of maternal and child health.

DONATIONS

Regardless of income, insurance, or education, the core of Healthy Start programs is our team of home visitors who provide individualized care, support, and education. This past year, our home visitors have been able to help distribute over two thousand items to families that benefits the baby.

COMMUNITY DOULAS

Since 2021, Simply Healthcare, Sunshine Health, and the March of Dimes have generously funded Capital Area Healthy Start's doula training program. This initiative has successfully expanded the number of doulas in our community, enhancing maternal and infant health through their valuable support and care.

SAFE SLEEP

The Traveling Crib initiative was launched in 2017 to educate the community on the fact that babies are safest when they sleep alone, and on their backs, and in a safe crib. This year, the Traveling Crib has traveled to 13 locations!

BREASTMILK BANK DEPOT

Established in August 2022, our CAHSC'S Milk Depot was launched in partnership with Mother's Milk Bank of Florida. The milk depot facilitates the donation process by receiving milk, packing milk, and sending it to the main milk bank, which screens and distributes the donor milk to babies in local NICU.

FIMR 2023 CASES REVIEWED

At CAHSC, we are fighting to reduce fetal and infant mortality. One way that we do this is through the Fetal Infant Mortality Review (FIMR) project. The CAHSC FIMR project expanded beyond Leon and Wakulla counties to include Gadsden, Jefferson, Madison, and Taylor counties.



CONNECT

PROGRAM

Healthy Start's Connect Program, also known as the Coordinated Intake and Referral Program (CI&R), assists pregnant women, moms, fathers, and families, with young children by providing a one stop entry point for families to learn more about community services and programs.

Our Connect staff consists of a team of social services professionals who are dedicated to serving local families and connecting them to needed community resources. This fiscal year, the CI&R staff received a total of 4853 referrals, 2509 of those were prenatal referrals & 2344 were infant referrals. They also completed 1940 initial intakes that asseses risks and needs.

LITTLES TO LEADERS

INITIATIVE

Littles to Leaders launched on September 20, 2023 at TMH and November 14, 2023 at HCA. In 2023, 53% of the children entering kindergarten in Leon

County did not demonstrate school readiness.

Littles to Leaders is a partnership between Capital Area Healthy Start Coalition, Leon County Schools, Simply Healthcare Plans, Tallahassee Memorial Healthcare, and HCA Florida Capital Hospital to provide "brain bags" to every newborn baby in Leon County. These brain bags are filled with resources to aid in early childhood development and increase kindergarten readiness.

There are 32 Healthy Start Coalitions across Florida. In the 2023-2024 period, CAHSC made significant strides, enrolling 118 out of the 717 fathers statewide—a remarkable achievement in our community. Our T.E.A.M. Dad program celebrated these fathers' accomplishments with a graduation ceremony, contributing 31 of the 100 statewide graduates.

COAST Through Pregnancy *is a FREE* program by the Capital Area Healthy Start Coalition, designed to support pregnant and postpartum women at risk of poor birthing outcomes due to high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, or mental health concerns.

COAST Through Pregnancy provides:

Blood pressure monitors, glucometers, and scales for health monitoring

Educational health information

Screenings for social determinants of health and connection to resources

Assistance with medical needs and community resources

Connections to doulas and mental health services as needed

The program ensures maternal health and safety by collaborating with community agencies to provide essential health monitoring tools and services. C.O.A.S.T. offers monthly telehealth visits with pregnancy navigators who guide and support women through pregnancy and postpartum.

16 babies have celebrated their 1st Birthday with Sister Friends.

93% of our Little Sisters attended all prenatal appointments. 100% attended their postpartum appointments.

In fiscal year 2023-2024 there were 12 babies born that were carried to term.

80% of our sisters are breastfeeding their babies.

Sister Friends Tallahassee was founded in 2021 as an affiliate of The Birthing Project USA. This program provides support and healthy pregnancy information to African American women during pregnancy and postpartum by using trained and dedicated female volunteers knows as Sister Friends.

Research shows that doula support during labor reduces the likelihood of preterm births and low birth weight, shortens labor, and improves satisfaction with the birthing experience.

We received funding from Simply
Healthcare and from Sunshine
Health, enabling us to train 37 local
doulas. CAHSC has contracted 15 of
these Doulas to provide services to
families in Leon and Wakulla
Counties. This Community Doula
program offers free support to
pregnant women during pregnancy,
childbirth, and postpartum.

2023-2024 UPDATES

Established in August 2022, our CAHSC's Milk Depot was launched in partnership with Mother's Milk Bank of Florida.

A milk depot is a convenient location where local moms can drop off their excess breastmilk. The milk depot facilitates the donation process by receiving milk, packing milk, and sending it to the main milk bank, which is responsible for screening all donors and distributing the donor milk to babies in local Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICU).



SISTER FRIENDS

Sister Friends TLH is a FREE and voluntary program that connects pregnant women to dedicated and trained female community volunteers to encourage healthy pregnancies by providing support to women during their pregnancy and following their birth. We are always recruiting volunteers to fill the role of a Sister Friend. Sister Friends will need to pass a level two background check. The program's time commitment is a minimum of 10 hours per month for up to 18 months.
